School News

Theme for the school year: HOPE. The school will be using the Ark of Hope Program throughout the school year as a service project. This program is designed through Catholic Relief Services (CRS). Special thanks to Jeff Berendzen who built the school a small ark to use during the school year. What a gift to our school! New staff members include: Patty Gibbons, art, part-time and Joan Kauffman full time Teacher Assistant for Early Childhood. The Early Childhood Program has 19 students and enrollment is closed this year with a waiting list to enroll. With the money received from the auction, new computers have been purchased and are already in use in the computer lab. New tables have been purchased for the computer lab as well. The science lab is set up and ready for use. New stools have been purchased to go with the tables. All science materials are now centrally located and accessible for grades 3-8. The hallways have been painted giving the school a fresh new look. Some classrooms received updating over the summer with paint. Teachers paint their own classrooms, the school purchases the paint for them. Teachers will be implementing the new diocesan Math Curriculum in the same process that was used last year with the new Language Arts Curriculum. The Curriculum is available for review upon request. **Self-Study Process.** The school will be undergoing its accreditation self-study review this year which is done every seven years. The members of the Advisory Board play an important role in this process. Each member is asked to serve on one of the standard subcommittees. Angie Kolb has agreed to be the overall chair. She served in this capacity seven years ago and is very familiar with the process. Teachers also sign up to serve on one of the subcommittees. The Visiting Team will be at St. Stanislaus School Feb. 21, 22, and 23, 2018 for the review and report. More details about this will be forthcoming.
